PE3 Action: Government Building Energy Audits

Program Summary: The attached Level-3 AHSRAE audit was performed by NYS Pollution Prevention Institut e in 2020. This report covers two of the six Town owned and operated buildings: Town Hall and Highway De partment. Other buildings include the Library, Parks Department, Sewer Department, and the Community Ce nter. Per this action, "The percentage of buildings audited can be calculated based on either the simple perc entage of buildings, or the percentage of square footage of the total building portfolio." This equates to appr oximately 33% of Town buildings, or by square footage, equates to 28%. The calculations for these percenta ges is attached.

Program Summary: The Town of Pittsford installed a total of 43 solar modules atop buildings located at King's Bend Park, 170 W Jefferson Rd, for a peak wattage of 15.48kW. These modules were installed by Solar Liberty Energy Systems Inc. in December of 2020. The Town has attached the contract specifying kilowattage and installer, as well as Facebook promotion and posted signage for the panels and images of the installation.

PE5 Action: Organic Waste Program for Government Buildings



Program Summary: The Town of Pittsford hosts a composting program at the Spiegel Community Center. Fo od scraps are collected here, picked up by Impact Earth, and the compost is returned to the Town for use in t he Community Garden at Thornell Farm Park. The Spiegel Center is 34,790 square feet of our government-o wned and operated buildings, totaling 112,527 square feet. This equates to composting in 31% of Town buildings.

PE5 Action: Residential Organic Waste Program

Program Summary: The Town has a yard debris pick-up program extending from the end of March to mid-D ecember for residents. During this time, our crews will pick up brush, loose branches, leaves, and yard debris. Contractors and homeowners may also drop off such materials at our Highway Department. Wood and leaf m ulch generated by the Town's yard debris recycling program are available free of charge to residents who vis it the East Street storage bins (enter at 34 East Street) located just before the gate to the Town Parks Depart ment office building.
